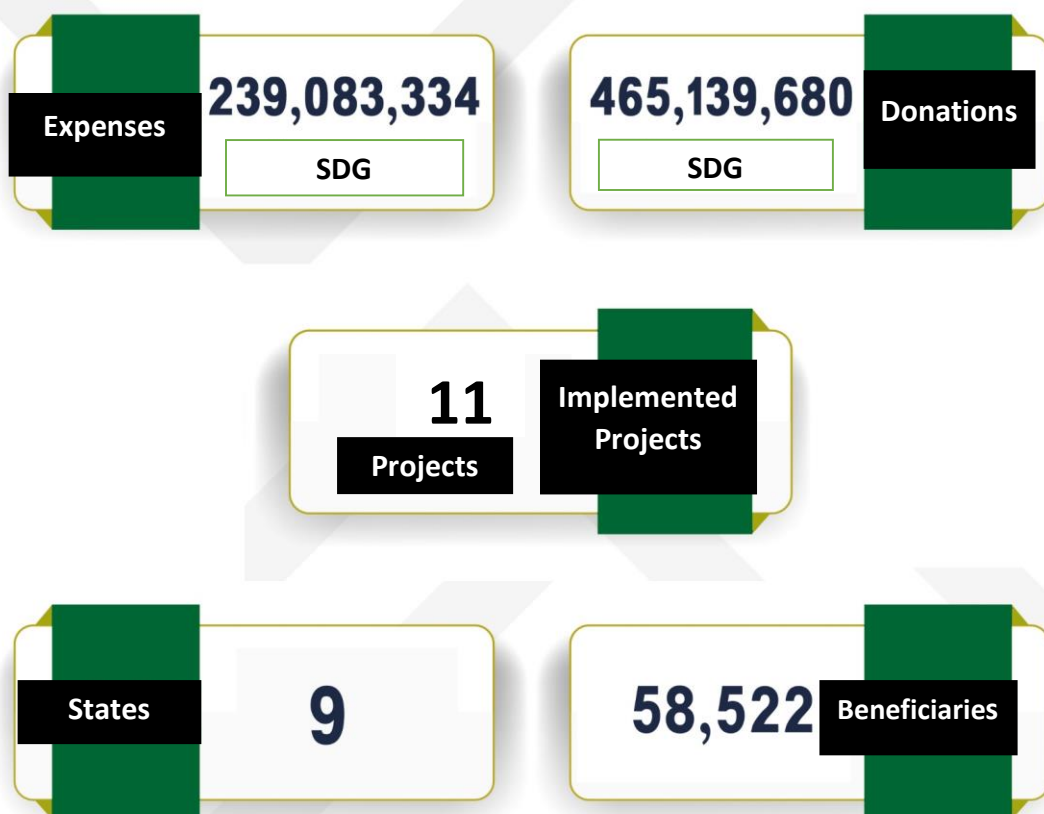

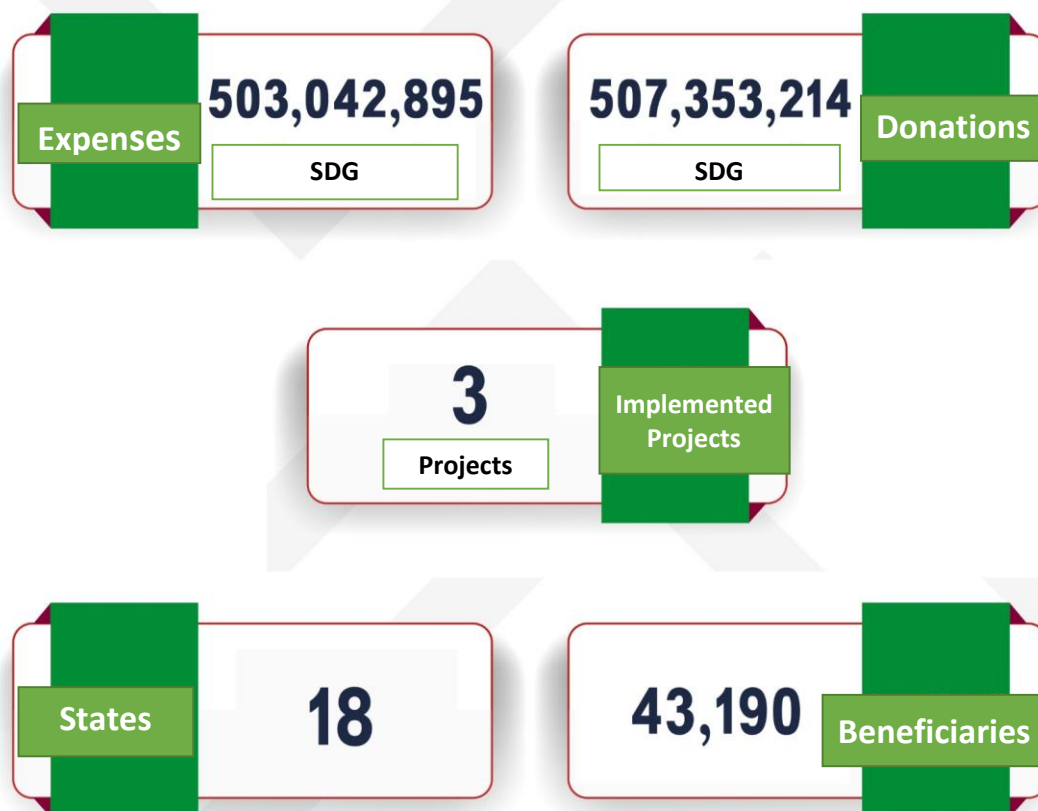

The above table, shows that the rate of implementation of the alternative education project (for the States of Al Gazeera and River Nile) UNICEF has been completed as targeted, but the alternative education project for the (Um Badda) region has reached 50% of the target, for several reasons, the most important of which is the drop out of a large number of students during the year, in addition to stopping the school year due to the third wave of Covid-19.

4. Feeding Axis

This axis aims to enhance the concept of charity, by providing a feeding service for the needy at different times of the year, as the Sadagaat organization has been implementing the objectives of this axis, by directing donors' donations to Ramadan Bags, Zakat al-fitr and Udhiya programs.

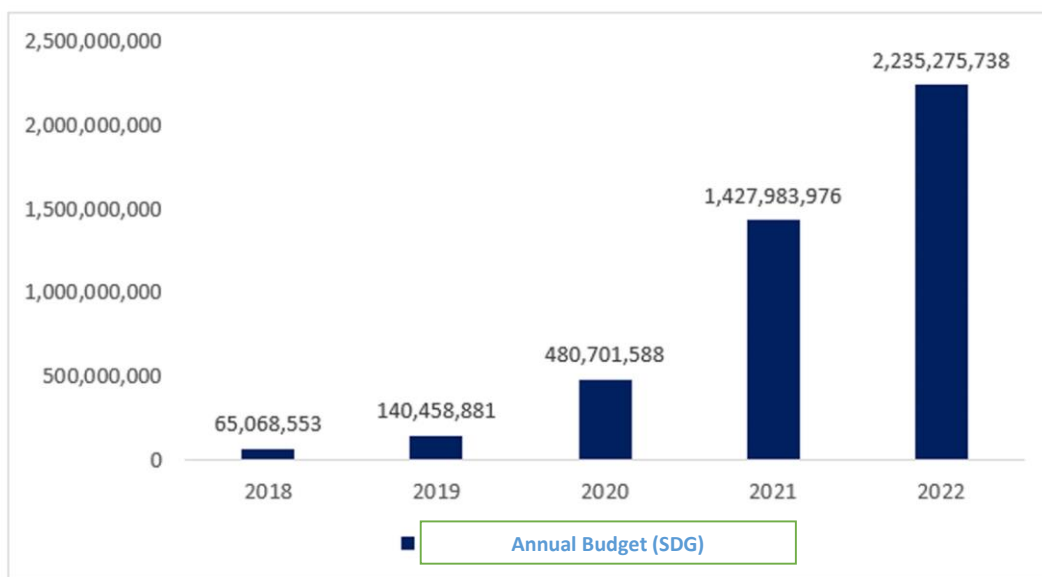

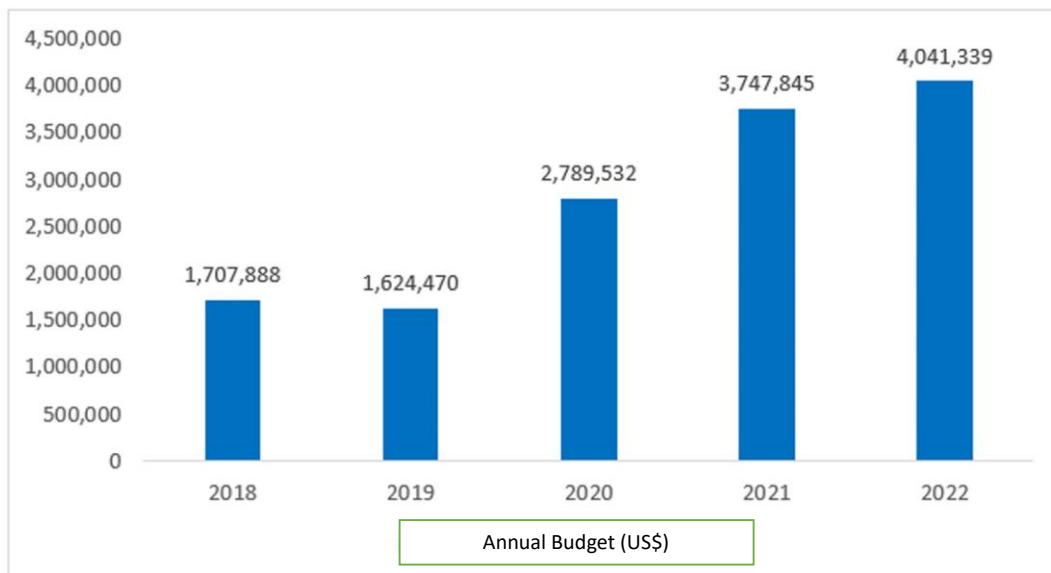

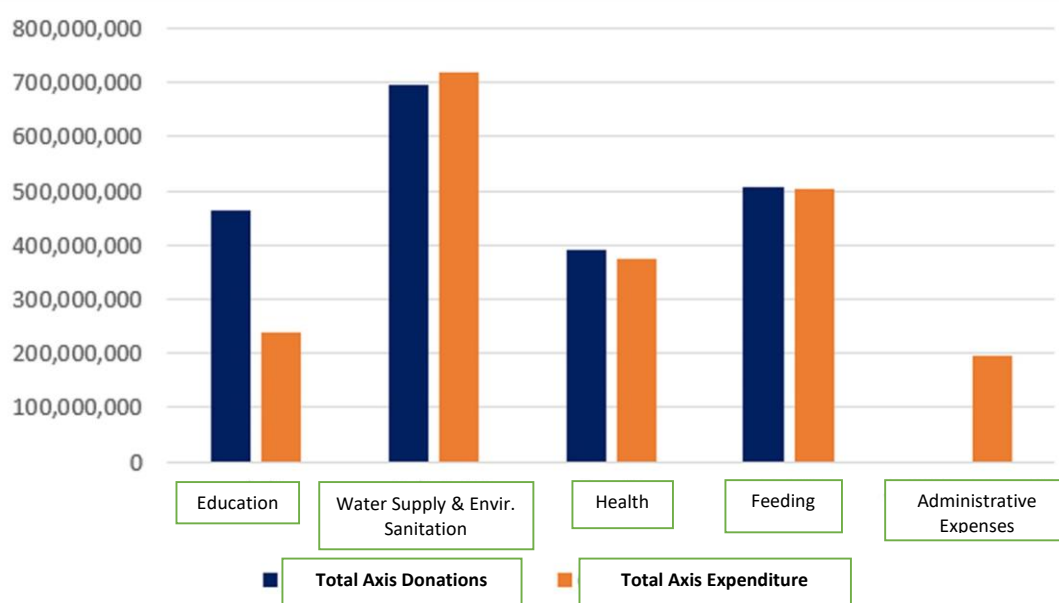
Financial Report for the Year 2022 Budgets Compared in Sudanese Pounds.



Budgets Compared in US\$

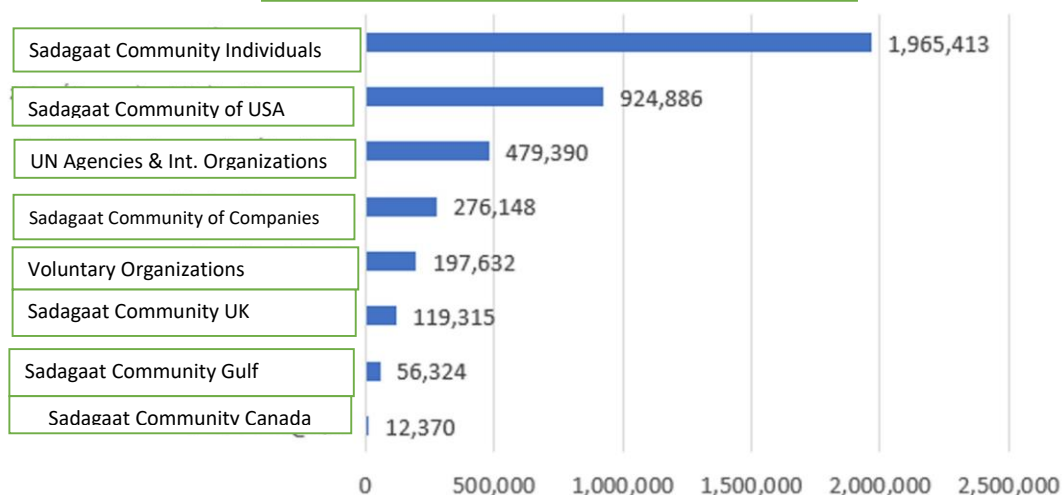


Comparison of Revenues and Expenses between Axes in 2022

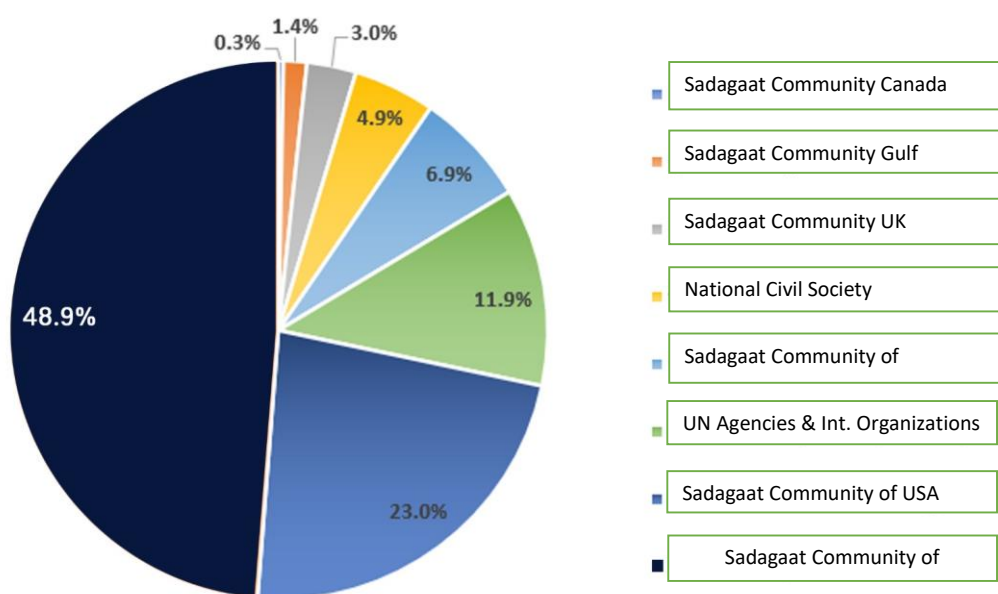


Revenues for the Year 2022

Total Donations (US\$)

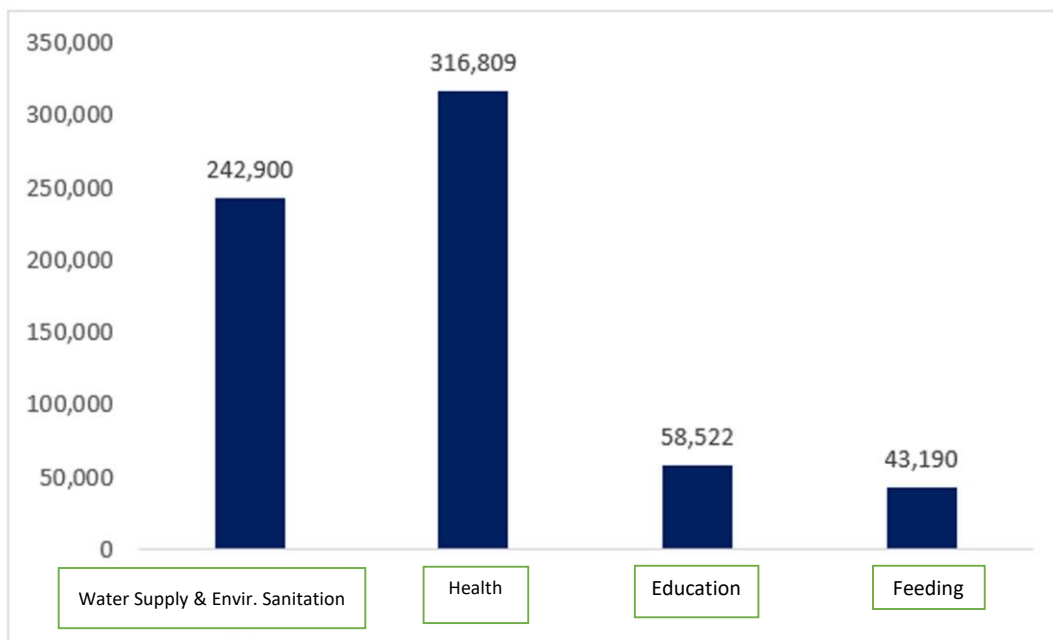


Partners' Contribution % to Total Revenues

Water Supply and Environmental Sanitation Axis





Water supply and environmental sanitation projects aim to provide clean water sources closer to the beneficiaries' areas to save effort, money and wasted time to obtain water, and to improve the health and social levels in the targeted areas.

The Water Supply and Environmental Sanitation Axis consists of several programs:

1-Water Supply Program:

There are areas where clean water sources are not available, forcing the inhabitants of these areas to resort to unclean water sources, or to move far away. The distance is often more than 3 kilometers away from them, so, they get clean water with great hardship to their places of residence.

Depending on the type of source through which water is supplied, the water supply program is divided into the following:

1.1 Groundwater Project:

Sadagaat organization provides a number of activities, within the groundwater wells supply project, in which the groundwater well stations are fully implemented, or the completion of the underground well stations that need to complete one of its basic components.

In 2022 stations in nine Sudanese states were fully implemented: Sennar, Northern and Southern Darfur, Western and Northern Kordofan, White Nile, Northern State, Khartoum and Al Gazeera States.

11.1. Integrated water well stations:

The Sadagaat community works to provide clean water to the inhabitants of these areas by contracting specialized companies to implement the Integrated Well Plants Project, which includes (well drilling, supply and installation of solar-powered submersible bulbs, installation of solar panels for plant operation, manufacture and installation of water tanks as needed, laying of pipes and potable water basins and construction of fences for protection.

1-2 Conveying Lines

Conveying lines constitute one of the projects of the water supply program, which is being implemented in areas located close to the main course of the River Nile, and in which it is difficult to benefit from groundwater wells because they are unfit for use. It is being implemented by extending new lines from the River Nile, or rehabilitating existing lines.

3.1 Hafirs:

The hafir is a water harvesting project that targets areas where it is not possible to drill groundwater wells, located far from the River Nile. Work is being done in those areas with the aim of harvesting rainwater and seasonal valleys, which are available in those places. Water is stored in improved hafirs during the autumn season, in order to use it in times of drought. The first objective of these projects is to provide drinking water for humans and animals, in many states of Sudan, where groundwater is almost non-existent. These areas are rich in seasonal surface water, which is utilized by water harvesting projects.

In 2021 Sadagaat responded to the appeal of the community of "Luka" locality. to help them complete a project to build a water harvesting dam, initiated by the local people through self-help, where excavation work and transportation of construction materials and mountain stone began with a popular effort. This has prompted Sadagaat community to respond quickly to the appeal. Sadagaat was able in a record time of three days, to collect the proposed cost for completing the construction of the dam and rehabilitating the old hafir.

In order to ensure the optimal direction of the financial donations allocated to support the people of the Luka area villages, which are located in Karnawi locality, North Darfur state. This cluster consists of about 34 villages, all of which are voluntary return villages in the region, which are inhabited by members of approximately 1,334 families. The engineers of Sadagaat Organization made a field visit to the area, which is 12 hours away from El Fasher by road, to assess

the needs of the area in the field, in order to determine the role of Sadagaat Organization.

Based on the report of the first field visit, a meeting was held with the representatives of Luka community and professors of the Faculty of Engineering at Nyala University who designed the dam. In the light of this meeting, a joint technical committee comprising the advisers and designers of the Luka Dam, the representatives of the Regional Service and Change Committee, Sadagaat and its technical arm Gianformtex, was formed. The Commission's purpose was to identify tasks, agree on steps and implementation mechanism, optimize the utilization of resources, ensure the safety of facilities and maximize the utilization of the project for the benefit of the people of the Luka region. It was subsequently agreed to visit the dam again in the presence of the Committee's representatives, but the completion of the visit was hampered by autumn conditions.

In February 2022, the Joint Committee visited the area and agreed to rehabilitate and reinforce the dam after it was discontinued by the people of the region, due to the depletion of their own resources, in addition to the rehabilitation of the old dam located in the area.

The work resumed again in April 2022. It took two months to complete the work in June of the same year. The project was delivered in December 2022.

2- The Environmental Sanitation and Personal Hygiene Program:

Sadagaat Charity Organization has begun to shift from the "Axis of Watering" to the "Axis of Water Supply and Environmental Sanitation". This is a natural development after the experience gained by the organization in this field. Sadagaat focuses on this program, because it is directly related to enhancing the health of the communities in which the water supply program is implemented. Then the implemented projects are linked to the environmental health and personal hygiene promotion projects.

It is worth mentioning that the organization seeks to ensure the establishment of a healthy environment, free of diseases caused by water shortages and environmental epidemics.

In 2022 Sadagaat organization continued to implement water supply, sanitation and hygiene "WASH in Schools", through completing a number of activities within the "Safe Return to Schools" project, which started in 2021 with funding from UNICEF in partnership with the Ministry of Education. The project covered 27 schools distributed over three states (3 schools in Khartoum State, 12 schools in Al Gazeera State, and 12 schools in River Nile State). The project included a number of the following activities:

- Completing the extension of conveying lines for the water supply to schools.
- installing a water storage unit in each school consisting of two tanks of 500 liters each.
- constructing communal hand washbasins.
- constructing toilets in 11 schools.
- Health clubs have been established to raise awareness of the importance of personal hygiene and environmental sanitation inside and outside the school.

3- Water Supply, Personal Hygiene and Environmental Sanitation Program in the event of disasters:

Due to the exacerbation of climate change effects, which leads to heavy rainfall and flooding in many fragile places and crumbling infrastructure that could cause the demolition of many homes and basic service facilities, Sadagaat Organization has included the water supply, personal hygiene and environmental sanitation in its programs. This was done to deal with the effects of autumn disasters, through providing basic services for water supply, personal hygiene aids and environmental sanitation, in order to avoid the outbreak of epidemics resulting from the proliferation of disease vectors.

In 2022, Sadagaat responded to autumn emergency appeals in three states affected by floods and torrents. A number of services were provided to address and mitigate the effects of heavy rains by implementing the following four projects:

HEALTH AXIS



Sadagaat Charity Organization, through its work in the health sector, aims to combat diseases and enhance health services in hospitals and health centers. Emphasis is placed on the referral hospitals, which have a high frequency rate compared to the rest of the hospitals. This axis is concerned with rehabilitating health facilities, providing health devices and equipment, in addition to training medical personnel and raising awareness of health issues.

The Health Axis includes four main programs:

1. Strengthening the Health System:

This program comprises 4 projects:

1. Hospitals Rehabilitation:

1- Department of Radiology and Medical Imaging - Soba University Hospital

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: Annually 20,000 persons.

Cost: SDG 3,200,000

Soba University Hospital is the largest teaching hospital in Sudan. It provides educational services and medical training for the development of health in Sudan. The aim of the joint cooperation between Sadagaat Organization and the hospital's administration, is to increase treatment efficiency rates and provide the latest medical services.

The Department of Radiology and Medical Imaging at Soba University Hospital, is one of the oldest medical departments in the hospital since its establishment in 1975. The department's rehabilitation and expansion project, which began in 2017, has reached an advanced stage in the year 2020. This was represented in the expansion of the department, and the introduction of modern equipment, including magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), CT scans, mammography, cardiac catheterization, and interventional radiology. Most of the devices have been installed, and work started as a first stage, in the first quarter of 2021.

After the completion of 80% of the rehabilitation works in the department, some construction works and necessary equipment are still remaining to be completed

so that the center reaches its full capacity. The objective of the project is to complete construction work in the department and to prepare it for the installation of the remaining devices, to ensure the continuous flow of catheter operations and to relieve the citizens of the high cost of operations.

Praise be to Allah, the maintenance of the Department of Radiology and Medical Imaging and the Cardiovascular Catheterization Unit has been completed very well. The unit was delivered to the hospital administration to start operating it directly. It is worth mentioning that the project has been funded by the Sadagaat community.

2. Ahmed Gasim Hospital:

A. Rehabilitation of the ICU Room

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: Annually 500 persons.

Cost: SDG 45,526,646

Ahmed Gasim Hospital is the only hospital that provides cardiac surgery and congenital cardiology for children in Sudan. These operations are performed for children, at the rate of one operation per week in the adult operating theater. This led to an increase in the waiting lists which reached 750 waiting children. After the rehabilitation of the operating theater, with the support of the “Sudani Telecom Company”, there are now two operating theaters dedicated for children's cardiac, quipped with all the necessary equipment for operation.

The hospital does not have a specialized intensive care unit for post-surgical recovery for children, so there was need for intervention to rehabilitate the ICU in the hospital, and equip it with all the necessary devices in order to operate. The rehabilitation of operating theaters, in addition to the intensive care room, will contribute to increasing the number of pediatric operations to 4 per day, and to reducing the number of children on waiting lists. All this will provide an integrated healthy environment for children to recover.

An intensive care unit with 4 beds and integrated medical equipment has been constructed. Equipment included:

- 6 patient monitoring devices
- 4 medical beds, one single movable bed and 3 children's beds.

- One monitoring screen and 2 respirators.
- 8 Syringes, and one ECG machine.
- 4 Infusion pumps.
- One emergency ambulance van.
- 8 Poles for intravenous solutions.
- 8-point grid system.

Praise be to Allah, the work has been completed in the intensive care room, and all necessary medical equipment and devices have been provided. The intensive care room was handed over to the hospital administration to start operating.

B. Providing a Sterilization Device for Cardiovascular Operating Room

Number of beneficiaries: 500 patients

Cost: SDG 6,900,000

After the completion of the work in the rehabilitation of the intensive care room, there was a need to provide a sterilization device for the operating room. This will enable rendering the best possible services to patients. The device is used to sanitize medical equipment.

1- Atbara Hospital Ambulance Rehabilitation Project.

State: River Nile

Cost: SDG 2,249,500

Atbara Teaching Hospital is the main hospital in the River Nile State, that provides general medical services along with specialized services. It also provides medical care for cases that need surgical interventions, and it receives patients (children and adults) from all cities and localities in the River Nile State.

Atbara Hospital suffers from an acute shortage of ambulances to transfer emergency cases, as there is one ambulance in service and the second is out of service. This prompted the organization to maintain and rehabilitate the non-operating the ambulance, to enable the citizens of the River Nile State to benefit from this service.

Thanks be to Allah, the ambulance at Atbara Hospital was maintained and rehabilitated by specialized workshops. The ambulance was delivered to the management of the hospital to serve the emergency cases.

2- Providing 10 Vital Signs Monitoring Devices to the Swedish Hospital

State: Khartoum

Cost: US\$ 12,000

This hospital has specialized in receiving and caring for newborns since 2008. There are incubators and central care rooms for newborns, in addition to the sterilization and nutrition departments.

The hospital receives children with respiratory problems or infections. Ten screens were installed in the neonatal intensive care unit, which were delivered to the Swedish Hospital administration to start providing services to patients.

Project Goals:

- 1- Securing the operation of the Central Neonatal Care Unit, and providing services to them.
- 2- Participating in strengthening the efforts of the health system, by enabling hospitals to meet the needs of newborn babies.

1- Anesthesia Machine Project for Atbara Hospital

State: River Nile

Number of beneficiaries: Monthly 1000 patients

Cost: US\$ 13,500

The anesthesia machine is one of the medical devices used by the Anesthesiology Department. The device delivers a measured amount of a standardized mixture of anesthetic gases and oxygen to the patient to tolerate anesthesia. The patient is monitored to allow the anesthesiologist or technician caring for the patient to adjust as necessary during anesthesia.

It should be noted that the anesthesia machines were out of service in Atbara Hospital, which led to the non-performance of surgeries for a period of four

months. This in turn, resulted in a long waiting list of patients due to the lack of this vital device. The hospital was in dire need of these devices to resume surgeries and reduce the burden on citizens. The hospital needs 4 anesthesia machines. Sadagaat Organization provided one device to start surgeries in the hospital.

The anesthesia machine was delivered to the management of Atbara Hospital, and 6 hospital engineers were trained to operate it. The device has been tested to ensure that it operates efficiently.

2- Energy Conservation Device Project for the Oral Laboratory at the Faculty of Dentistry - University of Khartoum

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries per month: 1000 patients

Cost: SDG 675,284.49

The Faculty of Dentistry was established in 1971 as the first dental school in the country, and continued as a department in the Faculty of Medicine until 1990 when it was upgraded to an independent faculty.

The faculty offers the bachelor degree in dental surgery (BDS), clinical masters, clinical doctorates, and MSc and PhD by research.

The faculty has earned a reputation for its educational, clinical, research, serves and patient care programs

The Faculty of Dentistry has an Oral & Maxillofacial lab. This is the only lab specializing in services and examinations for oral and dental health in the country. It also provides its specialized services to government and private hospitals. The project aims at the sustainability of the lab services, which assist the public and private sectors in testing and examining of samples.

Continuous fluctuation of electricity damages devices and samples. Sadagaat provided one uninterruptible power source (UPS), and batteries to prevent power outages and fluctuations. This was meant to ensure that devices and information systems remain operational when the power supply is interrupted, in order to continue working without damaging the samples.

The device consists of:

1. UPS SEP 1000 VA
2. SPS HYBRID -12 - 1325 VA
3. BATTERY TUBULAR 12V-200AH

It is a battery that provides additional time with a capacity of 240 VA, equivalent to 9 hours.

3- Rehabilitation of Children's Wards at Kassala Hospital - Health System Strengthening Program

State: Kassala

Number of beneficiaries: Monthly 100 children

Cost: SDG 5,648,000

Kassala Teaching Hospital is the main specialized hospital in Kassala State. It receives cases from all localities in Kassala State, as well as cases referred from rural hospitals and public health facilities in the state.

The Department of Pediatrics at Kassala Teaching Hospital contains two wards that have been maintained by youth initiatives in the state, and the capacity of each ward is 15 beds. However, the department stopped working and was closed down due to the lack of the necessary equipment to operate it. That is why it was necessary to provide equipment and tools for the department to resume its role, and that goal was given the highest priority. Thanks be to Allah, the necessary equipment has been provided, consisted of: 20 beds, 12 fans and 6 air conditioners for the pediatric unit in the hospital.

4- Al-Mugran Health Center

State: River Nile – Al-Damer

Number of beneficiaries: 13,000 Patients

Cost: SDG 8,075,000

Al-Mugran Health Center in Al-Damer locality, River Nile State provides health and medical services. In addition, it renders specialized services for vulnerable groups, and receives patients from all areas of the Atbarawi Administrative Unit. The health center, is a primary care center which provides health and medical services to about 13,000 residents in the targeted administrative unit and villages close to the site. The outpatient clinic receives 230 patients daily.

Project Scope:

- Rehabilitation of the main building.
- Rehabilitation of bathrooms.
- Removing the current plumbing system and replacing it with a new one.
- Adding air conditioning, cooling and lighting units.

Donor: CTC Co.

1- Saad Abul Ela Hospital

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries Monthly 270 patients

Cost: SDG 5,750,000

Donated by Sadagaat Community.

Saad Abu El-Ela Hospital is one of the main hospitals specialized in obstetrics and gynecology, which is visited by many women of different categories. Many obstetrics and gynecological operations are performed in the hospital. The increase of hospital visits by patients, resulted in lowering the level of health services provided, in addition to the shortage of equipment, especially the "sterilization device". This posed an urgent need to provide the device to sterilize medical equipment. Thanks God, the sterilization device was supplied and installed in the hospital, and health personnel were also trained to operate the device.

1- Nyala Dialysis Center

State: South Darfur

Number of beneficiaries: 900

Cost: SDG 4,246,358.20 (Donated by Sadagaat Community)

Since its establishment in 2009, the Nyala Dialysis Centre has been serving renal failure patients in Southern Darfur and providing free service to all estimated 150 patients. Some patients attend the center twice a week, in addition to new patients who enroll every day and emergency patients.



The lack of working machines, compared to the increasing number of patients, left the fourth shift idle for three months. Sadagaat Charity Organization provided a dialysis machine, which increased the capacity of the center and restored the work of the fourth shift.

Project Goals:

- Ensuring the continuity of the work of the dialysis center.
- Supporting medical services in the state, by providing a dialysis machine for patients in the center.

1- Neonatal Unit - Atbara Hospital (Under Implementation):

State: River Nile

Cost: SDG 17,293,119.23 (Donated by Sadagaat Community)

It was agreed to expand the incubator room in Atbara Hospital. A false ceiling and porcelain floor will be installed, in addition to an 18,000-unit air conditioner and painting and electrical works. Medical devices were already provided, including: two (2) monitors, five (5) syringes, five (5) infusion pumps, five (5) phototherapy devices, two (2) incubators, two (2) warmer devices and ten (10) cots. All required medical equipment were purchased and civil engineering works are now underway.

2- Soba Endowment Pharmacy

State: Khartoum

Number of Beneficiaries: All patients attending Soba Hospital.

Cost: SDG 5,557,359

Patients and escorts at Soba Hospital suffer from shortage and sometimes the unavailability of medicines and medical disposables in the hospital pharmacy. This forces them to go out and seek their needs from centers neighboring the hospital, and from other areas to obtain pharmaceutical needs. This causes severe hardship and trouble due to the distance, and increases the cost of treatment for patients by searching for the required medicines. The time factor is important for immediate response of patients to medicines, and wasting time in searching for medicines outside the hospital may affect patients' safety.

Project Goals

- 1) Providing pharmaceutical services in a location close to the patients in Soba University Hospital.
- 2) Providing medicines and supplies that meet the needs of patients and service providers.
- 3) Supporting needy patients by providing them with medicines.
- 4) Reducing the burden of hospital administrative and its operational costs.

Project Effects:

The following is expected from the financing and construction of an endowment pharmacy project at Soba University Hospital:

- Covering the medical needs of patients at Soba University Hospital.
- Reducing the financial burden of patients in searching for medicines.
- Reducing the financial burden of hospital management in spending on operation and management.

Project Activities:

1. Purchasing pharmaceutical items that meet the needs of patients and hospital staff.
2. Training of pharmacy management personnel.
3. Periodic follow-up and direct supervision of the pharmacy management.

1) Rehabilitation of Medical Laboratories:

1- Kassala Blood Bank

State: Kassala

Number of beneficiaries: 6000

Cost: SDG 2,568,780 (Donated by Sadagaat Community)

Kassala State has one central blood bank that supplies teaching and rural hospitals, localities and villages. Civil works are being carried out in the central blood bank of this state, by the Italian Aid. However, there is a shortage of blood bank equipment, in addition to the inefficiency of the existing devices. For these reasons, there was a need to intervene and provide some medical equipment in order to ensure the availability of blood donation services for the citizens of this state.

Thanks be to Allah, the necessary medical equipment were provided to ensure continuity of blood donation and work at the Central Blood Bank in Kassala State. The equipment included, two large refrigerators for preserving blood, in addition to six chairs for blood donation.

Atbara Blood Bank:

State: River Nile

Number of beneficiaries: Monthly 700 patients

Cost: SDG 7,564,516.3

The Atbara Blood Bank building has been rehabilitated. Civil works, painting, electrical and plumbing continued. One split air condition with a capacity of 24,000-unit has been provided, in addition to the construction of a separate shed for blood donation operations. As for medical equipment, a refrigerator has been provided for preserving blood, as well as one microscope, two shakers for mixing blood, two chairs for blood donation, a water bath and four laboratory lap stools. Civil works, installation and commissioning of all medical devices have been completed. All that was handed over to the hospital administration, to be put into use.

Oxygen Generating Stations:

1- Osman Digna Teaching Hospital:

State: Red Sea

Number of beneficiaries: Annually 88,320 patients

Total cost of the project: SDG 117,596,339.69

In view of the great shortage of oxygen in the Red Sea State and the resort to obtaining it from Khartoum, it was agreed to establish an oxygen generating station in Osman Digna Referral Hospital for this purpose.

The project aims to install an oxygen generation plant in the city of Port Sudan in the Red Sea State, and an oxygen network in Osman Digna and Al-Ashi hospitals. 180 oxygen cylinders will also be provided. The number of beneficiaries in hospitals is 88,320 persons; however, around

2 million residents in the Red Sea state will benefit from the station.

The project was funded by the Sadagaat Community, USA.

1- Oxygen Delivery Networks:

1- Installing an Oxygen Network in Soba Hospital Neonatal Unit:

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: Annually 480 patients

Cost: US\$ 20,588.

The Neonatal Unit - Soba Hospital provides its services in Khartoum State. Moreover, it receives patients from all other states of Sudan. The neonatal unit of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, contains specialized units in which rare and complex cases are diagnosed and treated. This unit includes a number of incubators, cots, devices and equipment necessary to provide integrated health services.

The two-room unit suffers from the unstable and unbalanced supply of oxygen and compressed air, due to the lack of oxygen networks in the unit. Accordingly, Sadagaat installed an oxygen network in the neonatal unit at Soba University Hospital. This project aims to increase the capacity of the unit so that it can provide integrated and continuous services to patients.

2- Providing Medical Services:

This program includes three (3) projects:

1) Providing Health and Medical Care for Children Suffering from Kidney Failure in Sudan.

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: 354 patients

Cost: SDG 16,619,319

Sadagaat Charity Organization, within the activities of the Health Axis, cooperates with a number of partners in dialysis centers, hospitals, and pharmacies, to care and support children suffering from kidney failure. This is done through providing monthly treatment, medications, and places to stay after the transplant operations, to ensure that the period of isolation and recovery is spent safely after transplants. When there is a need for rehabilitation and maintenance, Sadagaat Organization intervenes to ensure the stability of the service with the support of the Sadagaat Community.

This project included:

2) Providing Accommodation for Children after Kidney Transplants:

Project Name: Apartments for Accommodating Sick Children

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: 19 children

This project budget amounted to SDG 8,697,219. Sadagaat Charitable Organization provides, through these apartments, a safe and healthy accommodation for children to stay after kidney transplant operations and facilitates periodic follow-up until the completion of the recovery period. Sadagaat undertakes the costs of operating, managing works, in addition to providing needs of sick children and paying workers' incentives.

1- Noura Center and Al-Sabouni Center (Monthly Medications):

Project Name: Pediatric Kidneys / Medicines

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: 355 children

Budget: SDG 7,922,100

Project Profile:

Sadagaat Charity Organization provides monthly medicines for children undergoing dialysis at Al-Sabouni Center in Mohammed Al-Amin Hamid Hospital in Omdurman, and also the Noura Center at Soba Hospital. Provided medicines help children regularize their dialysis sessions.

2) Elnefeidi Center:

State: Khartoum

Number of beneficiaries: Annually 11,159 patients

Cost: SDG 15,995,604.20

Elnefeidi Center provides primary care services, and is located in Al-Haj Youssef area in Khartoum North. Sadagaat Organization is responsible for operating the center and providing monthly incentives for workers, in addition to contracting with other specialties so that the center can provide a comprehensive service to



citizens. Monthly medicines are provided to the center's pharmacy to meet the continuous need, in addition to providing medical solutions and disposables for the laboratory to ensure the continuity of work. A monthly petty cash is also provided to meet work requests. Periodic maintenance is carried out for all faults, if any, with the support of Elnefeidi Charity Organization and the Sadagaat Community.

1) Eyes of Hope:

State: Blue Nile - South Darfur - Red Sea - Kassala

Number of beneficiaries: 586 patients

Cost: SDG 43,418,750

Cataract surgery is carried out in cooperation with the Vision Charity Foundation and Makkah Hospital, based on the special waiting list, and approved health charity days. The Cataract surgeries were carried out in different regions in Sudan, including but not limited to Nyala, Port Sudan (twice), Kassala and Damazin. The number of beneficiaries reached 586 patients.

3. Health Promotion

This program composed the following two projects:

1) Launching a Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign under the slogan: "Because We Love You", in 2022:

State: 15 States

Number of beneficiaries: 142,637 persons.

Cost: SDG 20,792,759.7

Sadagaat Charity Organization has been working since 2014 to raise awareness, correct social misconceptions, in addition to familiarizing women of the importance of self-examination and early detection of breast cancer under the slogan "Because We Love You".

In 2022, the following activities were implemented:

Training Workshops:

10 workshops were organized to train 115 volunteers to raise awareness in the community.

Sadagaat Charity Organization during the Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign, under the slogan "Because We Love You", organized 42 activities in institutions, residential neighborhoods and public places. The number of participants reached 2920.

An event was organized under the slogan "For Her We Walk 2000 Pink Steps", and was meant to draw the community's attention and highlight the importance of breast cancer awareness. The number of participants reached **650**.

A group of air and sea scouts, Sudanese cyclists, motorcycles and the Equestrian Club participated in this event. The pink procession moved from the vicinity of the Nile Dome Hall to the Communications Tower in Khartoum.

As part of the campaign's activities, early examination and self-examination of women were coordinated in 13 health centers in Khartoum State, and continued for a period of six (6) days. The number of clinics reached was 65, in which 846 women were examined and 217 cases were referred to specialists for advanced examinations.

Breast cancer awareness activities were carried out in 21 secondary schools for girls, with an attendance of 11,200 participants.

The campaign activities were organized in the states in cooperation with various initiatives and 88 partners, including organizations and government agencies. Awareness activities were carried out in 15 states and 31 localities, and the number of beneficiaries reached 127,021. The activities that were organized included 156 activities in secondary schools, 22 universities, 6 boarding schools, 95 neighborhoods and residential complexes, in addition to 13 sites that include clubs and institutions. Thirteen training workshops were also organized.

2 Spreading the Culture of Voluntary Blood Donation:

State: Khartoum and the other states.

Number of beneficiaries: 1,877 donors.

Cost: SDG 1,098,364

The project focuses on increasing and raising awareness of voluntary blood donation in the community. For more than 8 years, Sadagaat Charity Organization, within the project of spreading the culture of voluntary blood donation, has been conducting periodic awareness campaigns for voluntary donation. This was done in coordination with the Voluntary Blood Donation Program and the Laboratories Department in the State of Khartoum. The campaigns were focused on establishing partnerships with many companies and institutions, which totaled to 70 partners. The staff of these institutions work to provide safe and tested blood for all groups in need of blood and its derivatives. Gathering areas and public places also represent an important source for safe blood donation.

The project objectives, include rehabilitating blood banks, creating a good working environment for medical personnel and providing required medical devices. The number of campaigns this year has amounted to 20.





Sudan is one of the countries with the highest proportion of out-of-school children in North Africa. More than 3.6 million children between the age of 6 and 13 do not have access to basic education. According to the statistical book of the Federal Ministry of Education, about 25% of those who attended primary school did not stay in school to complete the primary course. The number of school children in different states and localities depends on the size of the population and the level and quality of educational services in each state. The main factors affecting boys' and girls' participation in education are economic constraints related to poverty, low government investment in basic education, insecurity and social and cultural barriers (for example, the negative attitudes towards girls' education and insufficient awareness of the importance of education).

Sadagaat's education sector aspires to participate in the development of a high-quality, learner-based education system, which is accessible to all people in the Sudan. This can be done by contributing to closing gaps and solving problems within the public education systems.

The education sector of Sadagaat is relatively new, but it is growing steadily through the expansion of existing programs and plans to add new ones.

The Education's Axis includes four main programs:

1- Alternative Education:

This program consists of two alternative education projects, one in Um Badda locality - Khartoum State, and the second project addresses the humanitarian needs of needy communities, in the River Nile, Al Gazeera and the Red Sea States.

Due to the significant impact of the project and the need of a large segment of the community for the accelerated education project, Sadagaat, in partnership with UNICEF and the Ministry of Education, began implementing the program, which was started in Um Badda Dar Al-Salam region in 2018 to reduce the problem of school dropout. The project activities continued until 2022. Alternative education centers have been established in a number of schools in the states of River Nile and Gezira, as part of the project to meet the humanitarian needs of communities in need. The project included maintenance of school buildings, provision of school aids, teacher training, educational councils and other activities.

Alternative Education – Um Badda

In 2022 the school year 2021-2022 continued. The pupils who completed the school year were 133, of whom 124 were embedded in schools.

The academic year 2022-2023 also got off to a strong start, which forced the reopening of the third center - bringing the number of operating centers to 3, with 435 children. The number of children in the first category reached 216 children, 105 of whom were boys and 111 girls, while the second category included 219 children, 127 were boys and 92 girls.

The school grant for this year amounted to 288,500 pounds per school.

Accelerated Education Project in the States:

Various activities were implemented in a number of States. The following table summarizes these activities:

2- E-Learning:

E-learning is one of the means that supports the educational process and accelerates its transformation from the stage of indoctrination to the stage of creativity, interaction and skill development.

The latest methods are used in the fields of education, publishing and entertainment via tablets that are distributed to children. The tablets are equipped with a game-based learning program called "Let's Learn". The e-learning program targets out-of-school children from 10-14 years old, who are then connected to the intermediate level in the school or other centers. The electronic games that are used to help children learn are a group of educational games, covering Arabic, English, mathematics, ICT and science.

Project Implementation:

The project started at a cost of \$602,195 in partnership with UNICEF and organized induction workshops to explain the program details to teachers and target communities. The induction workshops were carried out in Eastern and Southern Darfur and Red Sea states. Community outreach campaigns were also conducted for the project's target communities in the States of the Red Sea, Blue Nile, Khartoum, Central Darfur, Eastern Darfur and Southern Darfur. E-learning unit officials were trained in the project, in Khartoum, Central and Eastern Darfur and Southern Kordofan States. Two teams in Khartoum and Central Darfur trained teachers in the schools targeted for the project. It should be noted that Sadagaat was selected as one of the national partners to implement the project in the states.

3- Education of Children with Special Needs:

Sadagaat Charity Organization seeks to provide a suitable educational environment for children with disabilities, through the rehabilitation of the infrastructure of schools and institutes (buildings, teachers, staff, educational supplies, environment, etc.).

Early Intervention is Everyone's Responsibility:

After extensive consultations and meetings with specialists from private centers, and the federal and state ministries of education - Department of Special Education, Sadagaat Organization developed a four-stage strategy: Early intervention, Assessment, qualifying, training and integration.

The campaign "Early Intervention is Everyone's Responsibility" was launched as the first step of the strategy. through:

- Raising awareness of the importance of early intervention, will help in providing the information the family needs, to know whether or not its child is different from his or her peers. In this regard, Sadagaat Charity Organization hosted consultants and specialists in the fields neurology, ENT and ophthalmology. In addition, the experiences of mothers of children with disabilities were highlighted, and meetings were held with professors specializing in the field of children with disabilities. Sadagaat produced a series of awareness videos and broadcast them on social and traditional media, as a reference for everyone who needs them.
 - A social media campaign was launched in December under the slogan "December Disability Awareness Month".
 - An event was organized to mark the "International Day of Persons with Disabilities", which brought together a number of actors from disability federations, relevant government agencies and national and international civil society organizations.
- In this event a number of recommendations were made.

4- Emaar Program

Emaar program is one of Sadagaat's distinguished and ambitious projects. The idea of the program came to improve school buildings in particular, and to build new classrooms and schools according to the needs of the targeted communities. This is meant to contribute to the stability of students within schools.

In 2022, the Education Department continued to implement some of the previous year projects, along with projects initiated this year. All projects are listed in the table below:

Through Emaar program, Sadagaat provided drinking water sources for 6 schools in River Nile State. The beneficiaries amounted to 2,600 students. The cost was SDG 1,927,556



FEEDING AXIS





The aim of this axis is to promote the concept of charity, by providing food service to the poor throughout the year. Sadagaat Charity Organization has been implementing the objectives of this axis, by allocating donors' contributions to execute the programs of Ramadan Bags, Zakat al-fitr, and Udhiya for us and for others.

Ramadan al-Khair (Ramadan Bag)

Ramadan al-Khair is one of Sadagaat's most important projects, which began in 2002 with the distribution of 50 Ramadan bags (fasting bag). Thereafter, the number of bags distributed to needy families, continued to increase year after year. One bag is enough for a family of five, throughout Ramadan. Distribution is done via delegates accredited by Sadagaat community. In 2022, bags were distributed to 14,812 families within Khartoum State and various states of Sudan. The cost of bags amounted to SDG 350,289,489.

Zakat al-Fitr

God Almighty prescribed zakat al-fitr as a purification for the fasting person and as purification of the soul. For this reason, fasting people rush at the end of Ramadan to pay zakat al-fitr, which is given to those in need. Sadagaat Community receives the amounts of zakat al-fitr, and it is distributed to eligible families on the specified legal dates. The amount of zakat this year amounted to SDG 90,015,696 which was given to 16,978 families. The distribution was supervised by Sadagaat Society and its partners (local and initiatives) in Khartoum State and in other states.

Udhiya for us and for others

The Sadagaat Charity Organization has been providing annual Udhiya meat to needy families and vulnerable segments during Eid al-Adha. Sadagaat collects sums of money from those who wish to give charity for the price of their sacrifices, whether they are inside or outside the country. The project was completed this year, and veal meat was distributed to all beneficiaries in Khartoum and other states.

100 calves were slaughtered inside the state of Khartoum, and their meat was distributed to the beneficiaries (patients, escorts in hospitals, inmates in prisons and correctional facilities, students of seclusion, needy families and vulnerable segments in Khartoum state).



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VOLUNTEERS





Voluntary work is a feature of the prosperity of nations, and an inherent value deeply rooted in the soul of the Sudanese person. Volunteers are the beating heart of Sadagaat community, who are relied upon to carry out many charitable projects which aim to bring joy and happiness to the needy and vulnerable. Sadagaat Charity Organization works to spread the culture of volunteering and provide volunteers with skills that meet their needs and the needs of the organization alike. In 2022, the number of volunteers who participated in various volunteering tasks reached 308 volunteers. The number of their working hours was 690 hours.

The Volunteers Training and Development Department, during this year, accomplished the following:

1- The “Volunteers Attraction Strategy” Project:

This project aims to introduce Sadagaat organization in universities and children's cultural centers. In this regard, the Sadagaat campaign was launched in 3 universities: University of Khartoum, Sudan University of Science and Technology and Bahri University. The number of volunteers enrolled in these campaigns was 109. A campaign was organized under the slogan "**Our Volunteer Children**" at the Bahri Cultural Development Centre. The number of beneficiaries was 200. The project also included the celebration of World Volunteer Day, where two video films were screened to publicize volunteerism at Sadagaat, as part of the celebration of World Volunteer Day in partnership with UNDP. It is worth mentioning that during the year, 412 volunteers were registered in the database and 550 new volunteers were added to Sadagaat's volunteer database.

2- Volunteer Capacity-Building Project:

This year Sadagaat implemented the **Graduate Training Program**, which aims to build young people's capacities, develop their skills and prepare them for the labor market by assigning them real work tasks. The program included intensive hands-on training across the organization's departments. The project began with the designing of the application form for the training period, which was posted on Sadagaat's page. The number of applicants screened was 71, of whom 9 were



selected for fixed-term contracts. Contracts began from June 2021 for six (6) months, until the end of November of the same year. An integrated internship training program was designed, consisting of five (5) seminars:

Essentials of Excel, Essentials of Project Management, English, Reporting, Communication and Work Skills within the Team-working.

The Volunteers Capacity Building Project also included training of (125) volunteers on Breast Cancer Awareness, Communication Skills, and Team Working workshops.

1- “Sadagaat in My State” Project:

Within the framework of spreading the culture of volunteering and building a volunteer base in the states, Sadagaat Organization implemented the program of "Sadagaat in My State", which aims to train volunteers in the states, communicate with them, and link them to Sadagaat Organization. The project was implemented in the River Nile State - Shendi locality during the period 5-7 April. Thirty volunteers from the state participated in the project.



PARTNERSHIPS & COLLECTION OF DONATIONS



The Partnerships and Donations Department is one of the most reliable departments in collecting donations from donors (individuals and entities). This department works to build new partnerships with companies, organizations, government institutions and various entities related to Sadagaat activities. It aims to develop Sadagaat's resources, strengthen existing partnerships and develop donors' database.

Partnerships and Agreements in 2022:

Expanding partnerships across all sectors depends on creating new ones, as well as strengthening existing partnerships with institutions, companies and organizations. Partnerships are one of the most important pillars of humanitarian and philanthropic work, as Sadagaat Charity has developed partnerships that have had a good impact on society. 4. Lack of up-to-date data and statistics to formulate plans and make sound decisions.
5. Weak infrastructure and weak security aspects in some states, preventing timely completion and follow-up of projects.
6. Sadagaat Charity Organization is on the path of good, thanks be to Allah, and then thanks to the generous giving of those whose hearts live in faith. What they offer will remain entrenched in the memory of time, albeit long, because man's age is not measured by years, but by the love of good and giving that Allah has placed in his heart.



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
