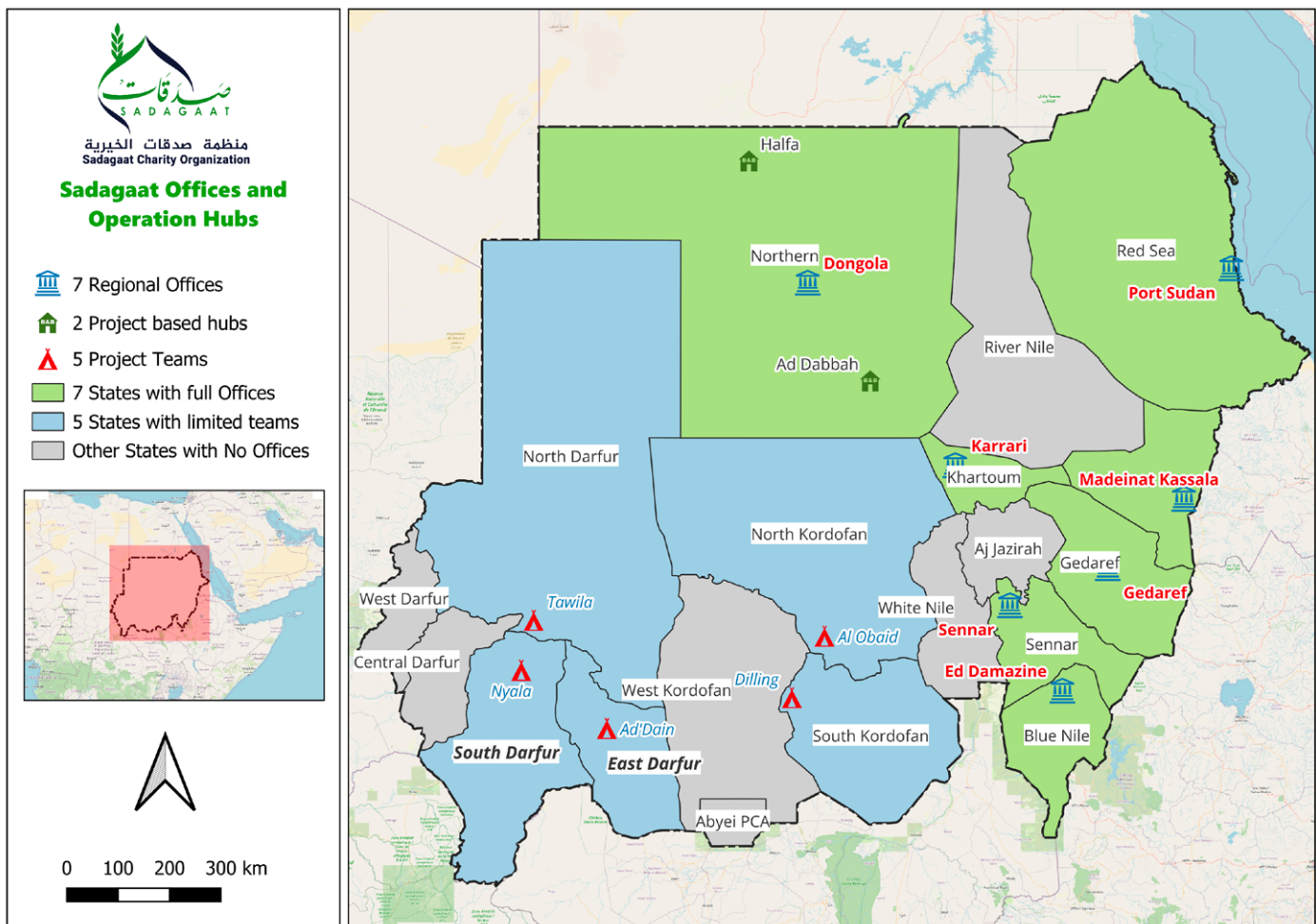

01 About the Organization

Sadagaat Charity Organization is a nationally recognized humanitarian and development organization delivering life-saving assistance and recovery support across Sudan.

From its beginnings as a grassroots initiative, Sadagaat has evolved into a multi-sector, multi-state organization, combining strong community engagement with structured systems to deliver high scale impact.

Today, Sadagaat operates across 15 states (Northern, Khartoum, Red Sea, River Nile, Kassala, Gedarif, Sennar, Blue Nile, Gezira, White Nile, North Kordofan, South Kordofan, North Darfur, East Darfur, and South Darfur), implementing programs in food security and Livelihood, Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), health, education, and emergency response, reaching over 1.6 million people in 2025 alone.

What This Means?

In 2025, Sadagaat operated in a highly complex humanitarian environment marked by conflict, displacement, and economic instability. Despite these challenges, the organization sustained large-scale service delivery across sectors—ensuring that vulnerable communities continued to access food, water, education, and health services.

This year reflects a shift from emergency-driven expansion toward structured, system-based delivery, laying the foundation for long-term resilience.

In **2025**, Sadagaat implemented **97** Projects across four core sectors, delivering integrated humanitarian and early recovery interventions:

Impact Story: Restoring Food Security Through Community Kitchens in Conflict-Affected Areas – WFP Community Kitchens Program (2024–2025)

The conflict in Khartoum severely disrupted food supply chains, markets, and livelihoods, leaving hundreds of thousands of families struggling to access basic food. Many households lost their income sources, while insecurity and movement restrictions further limited access to food markets and humanitarian assistance.

Vulnerable groups—including internally displaced persons (IDPs), elderly individuals, and low-income families—faced rising food insecurity, with many at risk of missing daily meals.

To address this urgent need, Sadagaat Charity Organization, with support from the World Food Programme (WFP), implemented a large network of community kitchens across key localities in Khartoum State, including East Nile, Khartoum, and Jabal Awliya.

The initiative mobilized a strong volunteer network and community-based structures to ensure the continuous preparation and distribution of hot meals for vulnerable populations.

Despite severe insecurity, supply disruptions, and access constraints, the kitchens remained operational for 18 consecutive months, demonstrating strong community resilience and adaptability.

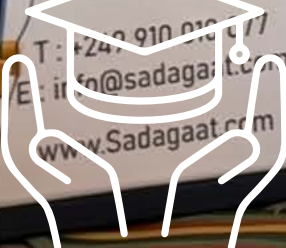

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Education – Protecting Learning Continuity

Education programs ensured that children affected by displacement continued learning despite school disruptions.



Impact Story: Expanding Access to Education Through Digital Learning Centers – UNICEF-Supported Program

Across Sudan, the ongoing conflict has severely disrupted the education system. School closures, displacement, and insecurity have forced millions of children out of classrooms, placing them at risk of losing access to education and long-term learning opportunities.

Many displaced families struggled to find safe learning environments for their children.

In response to the challenges of educational disruption caused by war and displacement, UNICEF launched the e-learning program as an innovative solution to ensure the continuity of the educational journey, while Sadagaat Charity Organization implemented the program on the ground. This collaboration successfully established 383 e-learning centers across 11 Sudanese states, enabling 60,507 students to reconnect with knowledge and pursue their dreams despite the closure of traditional schools."

The centers provided more than education—they restored stability, routine, and hope for children affected by conflict and displacement.

For many students, these centers represent a pathway to continued learning and future opportunities despite the ongoing crisis.

Youth Training and E-learning Capacity Building Program (Cisco–Sadagaat Partnership) – 2025

In 2025, Sadagaat Charity Organization, in partnership with Cisco and Sadagaat Canada, launched the Youth Training and E-learning Capacity Building Program to address critical gaps in digital skills, employability readiness, and access to structured learning opportunities among Sudanese youth affected by conflict, displacement, and disruption of formal education systems.

The program aimed to equip youth with essential E-learning competencies and prepare them for participation in the E-learning economy, future employment, and continued learning pathways, particularly in contexts where traditional education access is limited or interrupted.

The intervention was implemented through a dual online model:

- Sudanese Learning Hub – Cisco, providing structured, in-depth E-learning skills training
- Cisco Summer Camp, offering large-scale introductory E-learning exposure and engagement

This design enabled both depth of capacity building and broad outreach, leveraging fully online delivery to overcome geographic and security constraints.



2025 Performance Summary

The Sudanese Learning Hub engaged 616 youth through more intensive training (USD 55,000), while the Cisco Summer Camp reached 3,048 youth through a high-scale, low-cost model (USD 1,400).

Key Outcomes

- Expanded access to digital skills training across multiple states
- Strengthened youth engagement in non-formal digital learning pathways
- Established scalable online training models in a fragile context
- Improved foundational readiness for ICT-related learning and future employment

The program represents a shift toward future-oriented youth empowerment, bridging humanitarian education support with digital workforce development. It lays an early foundation for integrating Sudanese youth into emerging digital and remote learning economies, while demonstrating the scalability of low-cost online capacity-building models in crisis settings.



WASH – Restoring Essential Infrastructure

WASH interventions focused on sustainable infrastructure, including solar-powered systems.

Impact Story: Restoring Access to Safe Water Through Solarized Water Systems in Dongola

In early 2025, communities in Dongola, Northern State, faced severe disruptions in water supply due to widespread electricity outages and damage to power infrastructure.

Water stations dependent on grid electricity or diesel generators struggled to operate consistently, leading to frequent service interruptions affecting households, hospitals, and displacement sites.

As a result, many families were forced to rely on unsafe water sources, increasing the risk of waterborne diseases.

To restore reliable water access, Sadagaat implemented an emergency rehabilitation initiative to solarize five critical water stations in Dongola: Al-Bustan, Al-Basateen, Block 24, Block 22, and Guba.

Solar energy systems were installed to allow the water stations to operate independently of unstable electricity supply. Protective fencing was also constructed to safeguard the facilities.

The upgraded systems were formally handed over to the Northern State Water Corporation to ensure sustainability and local ownership.

Impact Story:

Restoring Mobility and Hope: Health Support for Conflict-Affected Children

The ongoing conflict in Sudan has left thousands of civilians injured, with children among the most vulnerable. Many require specialized medical care that is often inaccessible in conflict-affected areas.

Without timely medical intervention, these injuries can result in permanent disability or life-threatening complications.

Sadagaat strengthened its medical referral system, connecting vulnerable patients with specialized health facilities capable of providing urgent treatment.

A notable case is Mohamed Allam, a 13-year-old boy from El Fasher in North Darfur who was severely injured by a stray bullet, resulting in paralysis and loss of speech.

After being displaced with his family to Northern State in search of treatment, Sadagaat's referral team facilitated urgent medical care at the Police Hospital in Dongola.

Through the intervention, Mohamed underwent successful surgery to remove the bullet and gradually began regaining his ability to speak and move.

This case highlights the importance of effective referral systems and timely access to specialized medical care for vulnerable populations affected by conflict.

The intervention was supported through the Sudan Humanitarian Fund (SHF).

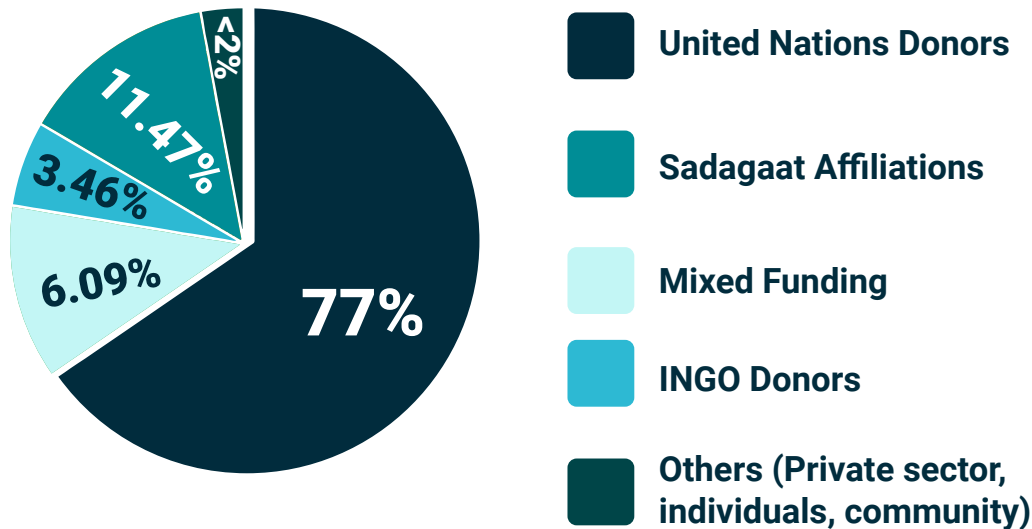

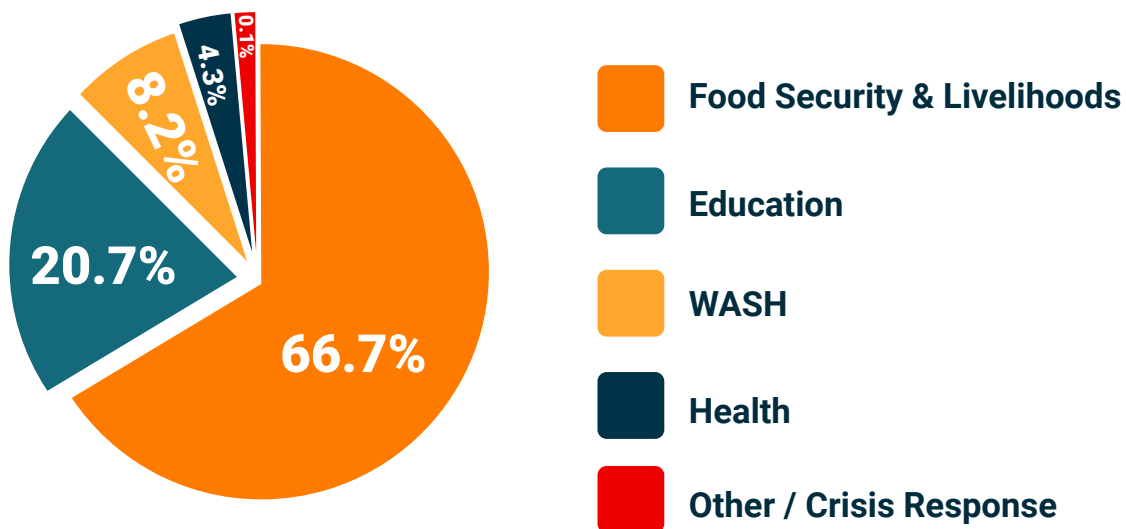

Funding Sources



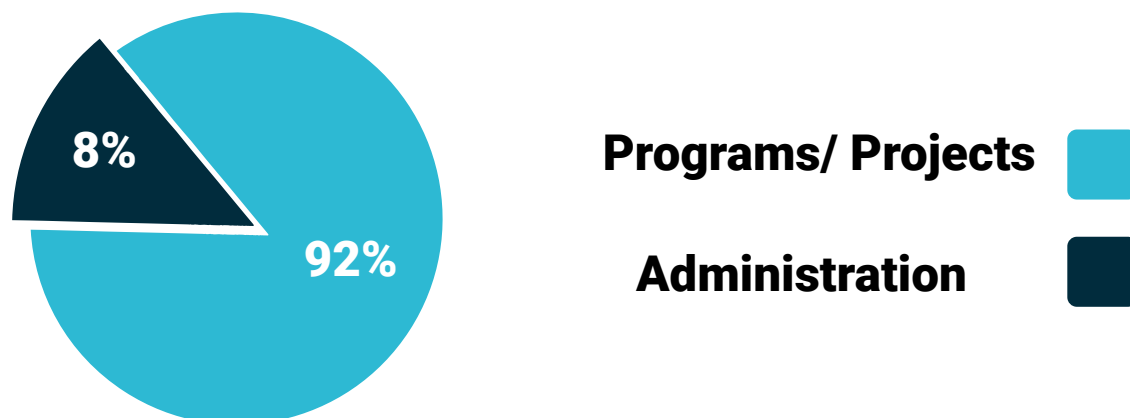
Cross Sector Distribution

Advancing ERP integration to unify finance, procurement, logistics, HR, and MEAL systems, improving transparency and real-time decision-making.
